TIPS TO HELP YOU DECORATE YOUR wedding venue

8. USE STATEMENT PIECES.



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P R I C I N G P A C K A G E S

• Friday Wedding. \$3750 (up to 125 guests)/\$4250 (126-200 guests) Friday wedding may book time to decorate the Thursday before for an addition price of \$100/hr with access to the barn at 1pm. Rehearsal included and may take place on Thursday from 5-6pm.


• Saturday Wedding. \$4500 (up to 125 guests)/\$5000 (126-200 guests) If a Friday wedding is booked, Saturday weddings desiring a rehearsal (included), may do so on Thursday evening from 6:30-7:30pm. If there is no event booked for Friday evening, Saturday weddings can have access to the barn on Friday at 2pm or after for set-up for an additional \$100/hr; rehearsal may also take place then on Friday evening, but must be concluded by 7pm.

• Sunday Wedding. \$3000 (up to 125 guests)/\$3500 (126-200 guests)

Venue rental is 10am-10pm. Sunday weddings desiring a rehearsal may do so on Thursday evening from 6-7pm if there are no other rehearsals taking place during that time. If rehearsal is unable to be held on Thursday due to other events, a rehearsal may take place on Wednesday from 6-7pm.

Weekend Wedding Package. \$6250

Access to the barn on Friday at 9am for set-up with rehearsal on Friday evening, but must be concluded by 7pm. Saturday event 9am until midnight with additional time on Sunday to clean up. Clean-up must be completed by Sunday at 11am with all vehicles vacated from the parking area.





QUESTIONS EVERY COUPLE SHOULD ASK WHEN CHOOSING A WEDDING VENUE

Here are some of the questions you should ask before you make a final call on a venue.

THE WEDDING DATE

1. Is my date available and if not, what are some of the other available dates?

2. Also, how far in advance can I reserve my date?

WEDDINGS PER WEEKEND

3. Will ours be the only wedding on our date or do you host multiple weddings?

VENUE HIRE

4. What is the venue hire cost and what's included?

5. Can I also get the price list for any extras that you offer, including décor and catering?

DEPOSITS AND PAYMENT


6. How much is the deposit for the venue and what is the payment schedule for the remainder of the cost?

7. Is there a cancellation policy in place?

VENDORS

8. Do you have an approved list of vendors that we need to use, or can we bring in our own?9. Also, what are the costs involved with bringing in our own vendors?





VENUE LOGISTICS

10. How many bathrooms do you have on-site?11. How much parking is available for guests?12. Are there any noise restrictions or cut-off times to be aware of?

VENUE SPECIFICS

13. What spaces are available to use on the day.14. How many people can the venue comfortably accommodate?

15. Are there any restrictions in terms of décor?

16. When can vendors arrive on the day to set up?

CATERING

17. Is there an in-house caterer we can use and what are the costs involved?


18. Is there a minimum in terms of food and beverages?

19. Are we able to bring our own liquor onto the property?

POINT OF CONTACT

20. Who is our point of contact going forward and on the day, and is it possible to meet them?

By asking these 20 questions, you will have a much clearer idea of whether a wedding venue is right for your big day.





COMMON VENUE MISTAKES TO AVOID MAKING

Choosing a wedding venue is a significant part of the planning process. Unfortunately, it's not impossible to make some costly errors. It's best to be aware of some of the most common mistakes that couples make before you start searching for your dream venue.

Here they are...

MISTAKE 1: NOT HAVING A BUDGET.

It's not difficult to dream of beautiful wedding venues. However, it's easy to be disappointed once you start looking at venues you can't afford. If you have some venues in mind already, ask to see a full breakdown of the costs to ensure it meets your budget. This will also help you avoid any hidden costs later on.

MISTAKE 2: NOT ASKING ENOUGH QUESTIONS.

You should always have as much information as possible about a venue before you pay a deposit. A venue's policies can leave you with additional costs you might not be able to afford. For example, can you bring in your own vendors at no cost? Do they charge for additional services such as restrooms and parking? Is there a cancellation policy in place? These are just some of the questions you should be asking.

MISTAKE 3: USING PICTURES TO DECIDE ON A VENUE.

What you see on a venue's website versus what it looks like in person can be two very different things. Never base your decisions on images alone – images can be edited. Always take an inperson tour of a venue before making a final call.

MISTAKE 4: NOT HAVING A ROUGH GUEST LIST

There is no need to venue shop with a finalized guest list, but you should have a basic idea of numbers. Your guests are an integral part of your day & you want them to be comfortable. Make sure the venue you have in mind can comfortably accommodate all your guests at every stage of the day.

MISTAKE 5: NOT CONSIDERING THE WEATHER

Your chosen venue should always have a backup plan, a plan B for if the weather takes an unexpected turn. Where will you get married if it decides to rain on the day? If your reception venue is in the open, how will your guests be protected from harsh weather conditions?

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
